

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

St. John's College, Agra, was established in 1850 by the Church Missionary Society of England, through the efforts of the Agra C.M.S. Association which came into existence in 1840. The first principal of the College, The Rev. Thomas Valpy French, a distinguished fellow of University College, Oxford, was a man of great vision and missionary zeal. At its inception, the College formulated its own curriculum and conducted its own examinations. In 1861 five candidates appeared for the Matriculation Examination, three passed the examination and thus, paved the way for the beginning of the College Department proper, as they proceeded to study for the University Examinations. The University held a First Arts Examination and a final Degree examination for the B. A. Class. Mr. Damodar Das became the first graduate of the College in 1865. From 1862 to 1888 the College remained affiliated to Calcutta University. With the establishment of the Allahabad University in 1887, the college was affiliated to it till 1927. With the formation of Agra University in 1927, the erstwhile Principal of the College, Rev. A. W. Davies became its first Vice-Chancellor and since then the College has been affiliated to it.

Initially the classes were held in Katra Abdul Saleh (on the hospital road); in 1852 the classes moved to a new building, which was raised on designs prepared by Major Kittoe, consisting of a hall and eight classrooms. In 1868 a new building was added, consisting of a hall and four classrooms. Upto 1896 the accommodation sufficed for the classes. The college was under partial eclipse from 1874-90 and the B.A. Classes had to be closed because the Government had

withdrawn the grants-in-aid to the college. From 1890-1906, the college maintained the B. A. Classes without financial assistance from the government. The government grants in aid were restored in 1906. In 1891 B.A./L.L.B. classes were started. In 1893 affiliation was sought for the M.A. course of Allahabad University. In 1893 classes in Telegraphy and Signalling were opened keeping in mind the employment opportunities in the Railways. Affiliation for B.Sc. was obtained in Physics and Chemistry in 1903 and for Biology in 1906.

From the last decade of the nineteenth century the college felt a need for the expansion of its existing infrastructure. The situation became so critical that in 1909, the college started two shifts. Since, no further extension was possible in the old premises, a new site was located and a new building was raised between the years 1911-1914 on the eastern side of the present M.G. Road. The general design of the building was planned by Sir Swinton Jacob "who had specialized on the adaptation of the Indo-Saracenic style of architecture to modern building requirement." The new building was formally inaugurated by the Viceroy and Governor- General Lord Hardinge in 1914. During the inter-war years, the College made remarkable progress. After the completion of the new building, other buildings were constructed on the Western side of the present M. G. road for the Science Block, Lloyd Hostel, Davies House and the Entomology department. In 1948 Mr. C. V. Mahajan became the first Indian principal of the College. In 1952 the College celebrated its centenary and a new Centenary Wing was added

to the main building whose foundation stone was laid by Bharat Ratna Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, former President of India, and was inauguranted by Bharat Ratna Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India in 1959. Under the inspiring leadership of the next Principal, Padamshri P. T. Chandi, the college made remarkable progress in its overall development. A new Central Library was inauguarated in 1965 by Mrs. Vijay Laxmi Pandit. Dr. P. I. Itteyarah was the first student of the college to adorn the post of Principal of the College. In 1987 a Bio-Sciences Wing was contructed under grants from the University Grants Commission. In 1996 another block was added under the postcentenary grant from the U.G.C. The College was accorded with the status of 'College with Potential for Excellence' in the year 2004. During the

academic session 2006-07, B.Ed. was started under self-financing scheme, while during the session 2014-15, B.B.A.was started, also under self-financing scheme.

Since the last two decades much impetus has been given to research and most of the departments have organized National and International Seminars. It is the endeavour of the management of the college and the staff to sustain the rich legacy of traditions and history and to look forward to a bright future. In Dec. 2016 the college was accorded A grade in the second cycle of accredition by NAAC. During the outbreak of the Pandamic 2020, online classes and teaching were started. In 2021 B.C.A. has been started under self-financing scheme.

PRESENT COMPOSITION

St. John's College offers courses under five faculties - three in regular and two in self-finance mode. The college has sixteen post-graduate departments with facilities for research and three under-graduate departments. The college also runs five self-financed recognized courses viz, B.Com. (Vocational), B.B.A., B.Ed., D. El. Ed, M.A. (Urdu), B.C.A., BPES & B.Sc. Biotech Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Psychology and

two partially self-financed degree programmes in B.Sc. with Industrial Chemistry & B.Sc. with Computer Science.

St. John's College is a co-educational institution with men-women ratio of 35:65. The residential character of the college reflects itself through its two hostels, one for women students (Davies House), and the other for men students (Bishop French), which is for research scholars.

SOME CHERISHED FEATURES

The day's work in the college commences with the Morning Assembly in the college hall where the Principal leads the staff and students in college prayers. Notices for the day and for the forth-coming important events and programmes of the college are read out by the Principal in the morning assembly.

The Morning Assembly at St. John's College has worked as a major cohesive factor in keeping together the college as a family and is, at the same time, a tradition zealously guarded by all.

A distinctive feature of the college is the postgraduate assembly which is for all students of the college, pursuing Master's Degree in various subjects. This P.G. assembly is held every Friday in the first period. Guest lectures on specific; general and contemporary issues are delivered by eminent speakers and scholars. This P.G. assembly aims at academic, moral, ethical and social emancipation and edification of mature adults of various P.G. courses of the college. In addition to this, bi-weekly classes are conducted in the college for the purpose of imparting moral and religious education, personality development and career counseling to all undergraduate students.

The Chapel of Invitation, situated in the main building, is used daily for Christian worship by the staff and students, often led, either by the college Chaplain or by a member of the staff.

The college Foundation Day is celebrated each year on 16th December with great enthusiasm and gaiety. On the college foundation day eminent men and women of stature address the audience on issues of higher education, true citizenship and on the challenges of life to be faced by the students after they leave the portals of the college.

The College also holds an Annual Youth Festival in which various competions in the domains of Literary Activities, Music, Dance, Dramatics and Fine Arts are held. The college lays special emphasis on various outdoor games culminating in the Annual Sports Meet in which hundreds of eager students of all faculties participate enthusiastically.



COLLEGE FACILITIES

Research

Research facilities are available in the following subjects and students may get themselves registered with Dr.

B. R. Ambedkar University, Agra for Ph.D. Programme according to the University rules.

Commerce, Economics, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Political Science, Psychology, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Mathematics, Physics and Statistics.

Library Facilities

The College has good Central Library with over 83,000 books, a reading room, open access and reference section for post-graduate and research students. Most of the departments have departmental libraries for post-graduate students. (For poor and needy students, there is also a text-books section in the library from where a limited number of text books, may be issued for the entire session on payment of nominal fee.) The students are expected to make full use of Library facilities available. Separate rules for the use of the library facilities may be seen on the library notice board from time to time.

The college library also provides 'Libtrend' facility to the faculty members, research scholars and post graduate students to consult more than 80 thousand e-journals and e-books.

Students Aid

Financial aid is available for deserving and needy students.

Guidance, Psychological Counselling And Psychotherapy

The Department of Psychology offers guidance, counselling and therapy to help students cope better with various problems related to their personal, social and academic needs. There is provision of assessment of IQ, Aptitude, Personality, Intelligence level, etc.

Learning Disabilities Diagnostics and Counselling Centre

Learning Disabilities Diagnostics and Counselling Centre is an initiative of the college to offer child, parent, career and couple counselling. The centre is well equipped with various modern psychological tests and scales for diagnosis of various neurological disorders like dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, dyspraxia and ADHD.

Students Centre for Indira Gandhi National Open University

IGNOU study centre is functioning since 1987. The Centre is activated for more than sixty (60) courses like MBA, Computer Science, BDP, BTS, JMC, MA, PGDIBO and many other job oriented courses.

Bhartiya Bhasha Kendra

(Sponsored by U.P. State Govt.)

The U. P. State Government has sponsored Bhartiya Bhasha Kendra from July, 2004. At this centre, thirteen regional Languages of India, viz., Kashmiri, Punjabi, Sindhi, Bangla, Marathi, Assamese, Telugu, Tamil, Malayalam, Gujarati, Oriya, Kannada and Nepali are being taught in the evening.

Students Christian Movements of India (SCMI)

(For Christian Students)

The Students Christian Movement of India is a students movement with Christian ethos and draws inspiration from the teaching of Jesus Christ. It aims to maintain a fellowship of students, teachers and senior friends with a commitment to translate Christian faith into action. It has been instrumental in nurturing the values of ecumenism, unity, peace and justice and has also been engaged in the mission of shaping young leaders committed to serve humanity, with integrity and commitment. It offers learning through Biblical reflection, social and cultural action, fellowship, understanding of group dynamics and experience of serving the marginalized communities.

Training Centre for IT Literacy Course of NIELIT

Course On Computer Concepts (CCC)

There is a Training Centre for IT Literacy Programme under the aegis of NIELT, Govt. of India. The course is designed to aim at imparting a basic level IT Literacy programme for the common man, to enable him/her to attain computer literacy, thereby, contributing to increased and speedy PC penetration in different walks of life. After completing the course the learners should be able to use the computer for basic purposes of preparing their personnel/business letters, viewing information on internet (the web), receiving and sending mails, preparing business presentation, preparing small databases etc. This helps the small business communities, housewives etc. to maintain their small accounts using the computers and enjoy in the world of information technology. This course is therefore, designed to be more practical. The course duration is 80 hrs.

After successfully clearing the examination, a certificate is provided by the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society of Deit Y. MoC & Govt. of India.

PG Diploma in Clinical Psychology

Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Psychology is a self-finance PG Diploma Course under Department of Psychology, St. John's College, Agra. The course was started in July 1997. During the course, the students are taken for field visit at mental health centers and counseling cells besides interactive classroom teaching and laboratory training. Time to time extended lectures from experts in relevant field are also conducted.

This academic training enables the students to work in a broad range of settings such as, medical, counseling centers, schools, NGOs, etc.

Placement and Counselling Cell

The College has an active placement cell which organizes training programmes to impart career skills required for good placements and successful careers.

RULES FOR U.G. ADMISSIONS SESSION 2025 - 2026

For admission to College in the session 2025-26, University Samarth/Web-Registration 2025-26 on University Website- dbrau.org.in is mandatory, without which a candidate will not be eligible for admission.

Admission to Bachelor of Arts (B.A. I), Bachelor of Science (B. Sc. I) and Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com I) for the academic session would be done on the basis of academic merit.

Application forms can be filled online at the College Website <u>www.sicagra.ac.in</u> The last date of filling admission forms will be notified on the College Website. No candidate will be allowed to fill the form once the stipulated time for filling the forms is over.

A candidate, with an admission form, would be required to upload scanned copies of their mark sheet of Class 12 examinations, a passport size photograph and special documents/certificates to substantiate their claim for academic and special weightage points.

Only students, who have passed their qualifying examination as regular students, will be eligible for admission. Students, who have passed their class 12th examination privately shall not be eligible for admission. However students, who have passed their Class 12th examination from NIOS will be considered eligible for admission to undergraduate courses.

If a candidate wishes to apply for more than one course, he/she will have to apply separately for each course.

Christian candidates must upload a scanned copy of their baptism/ confirmation certificate with their admission form. Likewise, candidates, who wish to

be considered for reservation under OBC/ SC/ST/ PH and EWS categories would be required to upload a copy of the relevant certificate.

Candidates will be required to pay a prospectus and registration fee of Rs 425/- online through the college website during the online submission of the forms. Candidates applying for B.B.A. and B.Ed will have to pay Rs 700/- as Prospectus and Registration Fee in a similar manner.

A soft copy of the college prospectus will be available to each candidate on the college website for free download

The academic index shall be calculated on the basis of marks obtained in the class 12th examinations. Special points shall be added as per university rules, in the calculation of academic index, Merit shall be calculated on the basis of the Academic Index. Special points shall be added to the final score, as per university rules. Merit list will be posted on the College Website on a pre-announced date.

Reservation shall be granted as follows:

Students with the highest merit, irrespective of the category in which they applied, will be selected in the Open Merit Category, which shall have 50% of the total seats. All eligible Christian candidates can be limited up to 50% of seats in the course, as per the judgement of the Supreme Court reported in

1992 Supreme Court Cases, page 558. If any seats in the above mentioned 50% quota remains unfilled, they shall be filled by the O.B.C., S.C., S.T, and P.H. candidates in the ratio of 27:21:2:3 + EWS 10% (Subject to granting of seats by the university for this purpose.)

The qualified candidates, whose name figure in the merit list, will be required to report for counselling, with the original copies of their academic mark sheets and other supporting documents, transfer certificate from the last attended institution and the prescribed fee. The qualified candidates will also bring a set of self-attested photocopies of the above-mentioned documents. The date and time of counselling would be notified through the college website.

Failure to bring any of the original documents for

verification and transfer certificate on the day of counselling will result in the annulment of the candidate's claim to admission, and the opportunity will be given to the next candidate in the merit list.

If the candidate fails to turn up on the prescribed day for admission, the opportunity will be given to the next one in the merit list and the candidate will forfeit his/her right of admission.

Subjects will be allotted on the day of counselling as per merit and the availability of seats.

A student would be considered as finally admitted after the payment of prescribed fees and other formalities.

Any admission done or any candidate selected for admission inadvertently or by oversight or on the basis of wrong or incomplete information provided by the candidate, shall be cancelled and the candidate will have no claim in such a case.

The college retains the right to reject any qualified candidate at the time of counselling.

Weightage Marks

Extra Marks (Maximum 17 Marks)

Merit list will be prepared by adding the extra marks with the academic eligibility marks, wherever necessary.

In any case, the total extra marks will not exceed 17 marks.



1. Every candidate will declare the validity of certificates related to academic and additional weightage marks in the application on his/her own. In case of any discrepancy the candidature shall be considered cancelled.

2. Any certificate regarding additional weightage mark will not be accepted after the declaration of merit list. Later, no other document will be entertained for consideration.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

Identity Cards

All students are required to get their identity cards issued at the time of admission. They are required to keep the identity cards at all times with them while in the college. Students' entry into the campus may be denied for non-possession of valid identity card. In case of loss of identity card, a student may be issued duplicate identity card after depositing a fee of Rs. 100/.

Uniform for Students

All the female students should wear White Salwar, Maroon Kurta and White Chunni and male students' Black Trouser and Cream Shirt during college hours. No student would be allowed in any other clothes/attire.

Attendance

No candidate shall be presented for any University Examination by the College unless he/she has attended at least 75% of the lectures (Theory and Practical separately) in each subject during the year in which the candidate is to be examined.

The attendance of the candidates at the University Examination as regular students of the college shall be counted for the entire session. Rules regarding attendance formulated by the university will be applicable in the college.

The shortage of attendance upto 25% may be condoned (15% by the Principal and 10% by the Vice-Chancellor) for valid reasons.

Hostels

The College provides residential accommodation for 80 women students within the College campus under the supervision of the resident member of the staff. The college also provides hostel facility for outstation research scholars.

Some Important Hostel Rules

Students residing within 50 km radius from Agra will not as a rule, be eligible for hostel accommodation.

- 1. Any student who after joining the hostel abstains himself/herself from the college classes for more than 10 days without any valid reason, may be asked to vacate the Hostel.
- 2. Before occupying the hostel accommodation, the guardian of the students is required to meet the Wardens in person.
- 3. Hostel residents are not allowed to keep vehicles in hostel premises.
- 4. Smoking and consumption of alcohol or drugs is strictly prohibited in the hostels.
- 5. Old residents should get their hostel forms forwarded by the respective warden before depositing their hostel fees.



Cultural and Academic Societies

There are several Clubs and Societies active in the college like the Arts Association, Commerce Association, Science Association, Botany Association, Chemical Society, etc. The membership of these Societies is voluntary and optional.

The students, desirous of becoming members may contact the Professors-in-charge.

Moral and Religious Education (M.R.E.)

The College provides moral and religious education. Participation in this programme is expected from all undergraduate students of the College. This programme aims at providing the student an opportunity to train the mind, to kindle the imagination, strengthen the will, cultivate the conscience and equip him/her for the service of the society at large and specially for the socially deprived and the under- privileged.

Parent-Teachers Association

Diagnostic and Counselling centre for people with learning disabilities.

The college runs a diagnostic and counselling centre for people with learning disabilities.

The college provides a platform for the Parents/ Guardians to meet at regular intervals with the teachers and the Principal of the College to ensure the progress of their wards. This provides an opportunity for the Parents/Guardians to discuss with the faculty not only subject related issues, but also to find solutions to academic and psychological/behavioural problems of the students. The Parents/Guardians are apprised and provided with the details of the classes taught in each subject and they are encouraged to verify the punctuality of their wards from the teachers concerned.

Orientation Programme

Special Orientation Programme is arranged for students at the beginning of the session to aquaint them with the aims, traditions, practices and various activities in the college. All students are required to take this programme seriously so that they can take full advantage of the facilities offered by the college.

Students of degree classes may join any one of the following schemes.

St. John's College Alumni Association, Agra

This association is an organization of former students of the College. The association offers life membership to the former students of this college on payment of registration fee. This association is intended to initiate interaction and interface between the former students and present students. The Principal, St. John's College, Agra is the ex-officio Secretary and Treasurer of the Society.
